San Francisco, CA, April 11, 2018 - The Center for Asian American Media (CAAM) is pleased to announce its program for the 36th annual CAAMFest taking place from May 10-24, 2018 in the Bay Area.

CULTURE, IN EVERY SENSE

Seeking to lead the ever-changing nature of festival programming, <u>CAAMFest</u> began to incorporate food and music programs in 2013. This year, "we wanted to really elevate the immersive experience between culture and community," says Festival Director Masashi Niwano. In addition to including four additional days of programming during its move to May that coincides with <u>Asian Pacific American Heritage Month</u>, CAAMFest36 broadens the festival to include even more ways to convey cultural experience through the world's most innovative Asian and Asian American artists.
