## DIRECTOR KULAP VILAYSACK'S DOCUMENTARY ORIGIN STORY MAKES ITS WEST COAST PREMIERE AT CAAMFEST36

**San Francisco, CA** - Director Kulap Vilaysack's riveting documentary <u>ORIGIN STORY</u> makes its San Francisco debut at CAAMFest36, the 36th festival showcase presented by the Center for Asian American Media (CAAM). The film is written and directed by Kulap Vilaysack (Seeso's BAJILLION DOLLAR PROPERTIES) and produced by actress June Diane Raphael (Netflix's GRACE AND FRANKIE).

When Kulap was 14, a blow-up at home led to the revelation that the man she thought was her biological father was not. There was another man, somebody from her mother's past, who once helped raise Kulap, but then vanished. Coping with that revelation was one thing. Coming to grips with why everyone — especially her mother — kept it from her was just as torturous. To disentangle the secrets, as well as the decade-long emotional paralysis between mother and daughter, Kulap embarks on a quest for answers.

Throughout this journey, viewers are taken on a wild ride that explores the devastating choices refugees often face, deep-rooted family secrets and the journey to motherhood. It is a relatable, emotional story helmed by the optimistic and vulnerable Kulap, whom you can't help but root for and want her discovery to lead to closure.

ORIGIN STORY will premiere Sunday, May 13 at 6:00 p.m. at the AMC Kabuki 8 (1881 Post St. San Francisco, CA 94115) as part of CAAMFest36. A panel following the film will feature director Kulap Vilaysack and CAAMFest's Masashi Niwano. A second screening will take place Saturday, May 19 at 2:10 p.m. at the Roxie Theater (3117 16th St. San Francisco, CA 94103) followed by a Q&A with Kulap Vilaysack and Jennifer Chu.
